The Museum is honored to offer virtual field trips to schools around the State of Wisconsin. Using the virtual tour of *Girl in the Diary: Searching for Rywka from the Lodz Ghetto*, our Education Director engages with students to answer their questions about the exhibit and the Holocaust. We hope to reach the schools that were forced to cancel due to quarantine, while reaching out to new audiences who couldn't get to the Museum before.

Many schools study World War II in the spring and our ability to personalize the experiences of the Holocaust is critical. We will be holding an in-service for Milwaukee Public School's Middle School Teachers tomorrow to share our free programming with them. Middle school education is just one of the virtual programs we are offering during this challenging time. Our programs have reached almost 20,000 people, with 14,000 video views and almost 500 hours of viewing.....all at no cost.

<u>Lunch & Learn: Polish Jewish Rebirth and the Rise of</u> **Nationalism**


