

Exhibits, Artifacts, Objects, & Specimens



About ten years ago, this Kayapo headdress of yellow oropendola and red macaw feathers from Brazil came into MPM's collections in an unusual way. It was seized by U.S. Fish and Wildlife agents in Chicago from an area art gallery that illegally imported this piece and several other feathered items from Brazil. Items seized in this manner are not returned to their country of origin since they do not want them to go back into the cycle of illegal activity. These situations present a remarkable opportunity for museums to legally obtain objects that otherwise would be impossible to procure and allow us to make them available for research and education programs.

MPM INSIGHTS A Look Behind the Scenes



MPM has been collecting specimens for over 135 years and not only are they used for creating exhibits, but they are studied by scientists and researchers throughout the world. Our Zoology Collections Manager Julia Colby (@MPMZoology) has to do fluid jar and lid checks on specimens like this one yearly, as they go out for or come back from loans to scientists and researchers. If you're like us, you might have wondered why she has to do this.

Well, many vertebrate and invertebrate collections are stored in a specific mixture of 70% ethyl alcohol and 30% water to protect them. Over time, fluid evaporates, the mixture gets weaker, and it doesn't preserve the specimen as well. To prevent damage, Julia will use a hydrometer, a tool that measures the relative density of liquids, and makes an adjustment to the fluid ratio to keep the specimen safe.
