Our recent move has left little time to publish a newsletter recently. However, we wanted to let you know what we've been up to lately and ask for your continued support.

We moved into the new house on November 1. The new zendo is quiet and sunny. It seats nine to twelve people comfortably, and it will seat two or three more when curtains are made and hung. The dining room serves as a class, meeting and breakfast place, and as the Akiyamas' living room. The kitchen is large enough for both the Akiyamas and the Center to use. In addition, there is space in closets and basement for storing altar things, oryoki, sewing materials and other items. Our library has space in the entry hall and is now available to members again. Finally, there are ample accommodations for visitors during sesshins and at other times.

Much time and effort has gone into making needed repairs and renovations. We have painted the downstairs, cleaned out the basement, fixed the water heater, pulled out weeds, and done a variety of other chores to make the place liveable. A number of things also remain to be done - repairing the hot water in the bathroom, finishing the painting, making curtains for the zendo entrances, completing winterization and many other smaller projects.
