Unitarian Church North is a member congregation of the Unitarian Universalist denomination. Our Building & Grounds

The architecture of Unitarian Church North replicates the octagonal Clausing barns built in Ozaukee County in the 1800s. The church maintains an eight-acre natural landscape of tall grasses, prairie flowers and other native plants to complement the building's distinctive architecture and rural setting. The landscape policy is to keep all introduced plants native to this area and planted in informal, natural arrangements. Many of our landscape improvements are the result of gifts and memorials. Much volunteer labor is provided in planting and maintaining the property. The grounds include a woodland nature trail, beginning at the footbridge over our pond, a fire-council ring, gazebo and children's play area. Our landscape is a resource for nature study as well as a place for fellowship.

Our religious education program encourages children and adults to wonder, ask questions and discover. We explore themes such as Unitarian Universalist identity, world religions, peace & justice, the web of life, and social justice -- with a focus on spiritual growth and faith exploration in the context of a caring community.
