# Chinese Christian Church of Milwaukee

## Historical Overview:

In 1974 Wang Changming, also known as Peter Wang, a Chinese graduate student at Wheaton College, led a student retreat to Milwaukee. After his graduation he established a Chinese Missionary Association in affiliation with the Southern Baptist Church. In 1976 he left the Chinese Mission and began a Chinese Christian Fellowship at the Brown Deer Baptist Church in Milwaukee. In 1978 this group decided to change their name to the Chinese Christian Church of Milwaukee, and in 1981 they were officially registered under that name. The congregation continued to grow, necessitating a move to a new and larger location; in 1987 they held their first services at Trinity Community Church, also in Brown Deer. Starting in 1995 the church executives began discussing building their own church to accommodate the growing congregation. During the congregation's time at Trinity the congregation continued to grow and there was an increase in English-speaking Chinese joining the congregation. In the early 1990s the church began its first English ministry. In 1998 Pastor Wang Changming retired. A group of elders and deacons filled in as the preaching team during the search for a new pastor, until Andy Tso was hired later that same year. In 2000 they found their new place of worship at their current location, 2519 East Kenwood Blvd. in Milwaukee, the former home of the Fourth Church of Christ Scientist. On January 01, 2001 the congregation held an inauguration service in their new space, with regular Sunday services beginning a couple months later. In 2002, the church held the first summer bible school and also began a ministry for those in the food and beverage service industry, meeting Sunday nights at 10 p.m. to accommodate the work schedules of those individuals. In 2003 they celebrated their 25th anniversary. Since coming to their new home, the congregation has continued to grow and develop. Weekly services are offered in both English and Chinese, with simultaneous translation from Mandarin to Cantonese during the Chinese service. Once a month there is a combined worship service, with translation from English to Mandarin and vice versa. There are numerous language classes, religious education classes, bible studies that meet across the greater Milwaukee area, and a weekly congregational meal. The church celebrated its 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary in May of this year.

1975	Pastor Wang graduates and is accepted at the Southern Baptist church; he establishes the Chinese Missionary Association.
1976	Pastor Wang leaves the Chinese Mission to lead Chinese students at the Brown Deer Baptist Church.
1977	"Prestige," the church newsletter, begins to be published monthly in January. In February, Pastor Wang establishes Chinese Student Bible Study Class at UWM.
1978	The Chinese Christian Fellowship is established at the Brown Deep Baptist Church.
06/1979	The fellowship changes their name to the Chinese Christian Church of Milwaukee.
08/21/1981	The Chinese Christian Church is officially registered.

10/22/1981	Children's Sunday School begins.
01/1982	English Bible study begins.
02/1984	Choir is established.
1985	Chinese school begins.
03/1986	Children's English worship begins.
01/18/1987	The congregation meets for the first time at their new location, renting from the Trinity Community Church
03/1988	Translation headphones introduced for English-speaking congregants.
05/01/1988	Tenth anniversary of the church is celebrated.
05/28/1988	The first spring festival is held in Lake Geneva.
12/09/1990	English worship begins.
1992	First youth group retreat.
01/1993	First Cantonese bible study class, held in church member home.
04/1993	Fifteenth anniversary of "Prestige," the church newsletter publication.
07/17/1994	The first reading of the Church Charter.
1994	Meal after first Sunday (local Chinese). English translation services on the third Sunday of the month. Simultaneous translation from Chinese and Cantonese on the other Sundays.
1995	Executive Meeting discusses the topic of church construction.
1997	English bible study for Chinese students at Medical College of Wisconsin
01/1998	Pastor Wang retires.
05/1998	20 <sup>th</sup> anniversary of the church. Pastor Wang returns to celebrate with the congregation.
09/1998	The Executive Council hires the first minister of the English Department.
05/2000	The Kenwood site is found and passed bids to the seller through the executive committee and the general assembly.
08/06/2000	General assembly dedicates itself to the purchase of the site's new chapel.
11/10/2000	Officially own the new space.
11/18/2000	The congregation goes to the new space to begin renovations, including painting.
01/01/2001	Inauguration ceremony and the first baby dedication ceremony.
03/2001	First regular Sunday worship in the new space.
08/2002	First summer bible school.
10/2002	Started Sunday night ministry for those who work in the service industry.
2003	25 <sup>th</sup> anniversary of the church.
03/2005	The church organizes an extended theology course for the first time.
10/2006	"Prestige" church newsletter begins digital publication and email distribution
05/2007	Church hosts first "Study Day," opening its doors and providing meals to UWM and Marquette students studying for finals

05/2008	CCCM members donate \$30,000 and the church allocates \$10,000 for earthquake relief in Wenchuan, Sichuan, China.
06/2008	$30^{\text{th}}$ anniversary of the church is celebrated, with Pastor Wang returning to preach.
05/05/2013	35 <sup>th</sup> anniversary of the church is celebrated.
7/30/2016	Dragon Boat race
$M_{ov} 2018$	10th anniversary of the church

May 2018 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the church.

#### Annotated Bibliography
